

Things get solved if you get involved

It's coming back.....

Some years ago, the Astons had a Villagers Christmas Post Box. Rather than you walk around delivering cards, Santa's helpers have returned and will deliver them. All you need to do is put the individual's name or family name and the house name on the card and pop it into the post box located in the reception area of the Chequers garage. Santas helpers time is free but, as per previous times, if you would like to make a donation, please pop it into the



post box with your cards. The donations will go to a local charity. The last collection will be Monday 18th December.



Get creative:

There a just a few places left on the Wreath / Table Centre Piece workshop (see Dates for your Diary table below for timings). The cost is £20 per person. We will be providing mulled wine and mince pies, along with all you need to make your decorations but if you do want to bring some of your own, to personalise, please do so.

Wildlife Rehabilitation

Because the talks we have held previously relating to wildlife subjects have been so popular you will also see from the Dates for Your Diary that we have a guest speaker coming to talk about the work being carried out at a local Wildlife rescue centre.



What to do in the garden:

- Keep feeding the birds and wash the feeders regularly to minimise diseases spreading
- Rambling roses flower on the long whippy shoots produced last year. After the birds have taken any rose hips, cut out all the stems that have flowered. Attach these to the support as horizontally as possible to encourage blooms that cover the plant rather than towering out of sight
- Lightly prune Japanese Maple, lightly to retain its shape. Pruning should be done before Christmas as they
 come into growth early in the new year and would bleed sap if pruned too late
- Oriental Hellebore If you haven't had chance to cut the leaves back to ground level do it now so you get a clear view of the flowers. The flowers may be emerging now so be careful not to cut them by mistake.
- Native Hedges contain useful food sources for wildlife so try and wait until the new year and then a looser, wilder look than a formal hedge



Thank you very much to the 2,127 people who signed my petition to re-open Grove Station.

We are the proud home of the 11 EOD and Search Regiment at Vauxhall Barracks in Didcot, and it was a pleasure to visit again and meet Lt Col Rob Swan and the team. Just this year they have so far responded to more than 1,800 requests in the UK to deal with explosive devices and I planted a remembrance stake in Parliament's Garden of Remembrance in their honour.

Parliament Week takes place every November, and I was pleased to visit local schools and talk to different youth organisations about my role as an MP and how they can get involved in politics, including: Wallingford School, St Michael's CofE Primary School in Steventon, Brightwell Primary School, St Blaise Primary School, the 7th Abingdon Beavers, Chilton Explorer Scout Unit and Brightwell cum Sotwell Scouts.

- * The Millennium bench on the Hagbourne Road is looking tired and in need of some repairs to improve its condition. Littering around the bench has also become an issue. The PC wonder, is another bin needed, or does the bench need moving, perhaps? Some ideas are needed on what to do. However, the PC feel it is best to leave any repairs to the bench until the Spring and will re address then.
- * There is a Link available on Facebook for residents to report any large vehicles passing through the village that shouldn't be and any damage that is caused.

* There is one area we feel as a church we could justify asking for money and that is the handrails that go from Aston Street towards St Michaels church. Discovering and recording the Astons through the ages

OUR LATEST ADDITION:

The marvels of eBay! Below top right is a photo by EL Leach of the original Boot Inn in Thorpe Street - a view we've never seen before. I say the original because it burnt down in the mid 1930s and a new pub, now 'The Old Boot House', was built. John Lightfoot (who lived in the Astons as a child during WW2) told us that it was up and running before the war started, and also told us that when the Allies' victory was declared in June 1945 the pub piano was taken out onto the forecourt to accompany the celebratory singing and dancing. (We think the new pub was probably built further back to provide space for parking -

obviously not a factor when the original was built).

This photo also shows Stockwells Cottage further along the road, and if you look closely you will see a front door opening directly onto the road, since removed.

The door can be seen more clearly in the street view taken from the other direction, see bottom right. That photo appeared on the Astons Facebook back in 2020, with memories by David Brownlie and John Lightfoot - see below to the left of the photo.

Old photos and village memories are vital aids to our understanding of past elements of village life which would otherwise be forgotten.

Brakspears Brewery sold The Boot in 1992, much lamented.



An earlier (1900s) view showing just the Boot sign and a picket fence.

"The barn on the right is where they kept the Green Goddess fire engine. I can remember them doing fire practice in the orchard and using water from the pond in Baker Street". David Brownlie.

"On the right before the wall you can see a large door that was the Strange's barn/shed; they dealt in fruit cherries etc. They used to buy up lots of cherry orchards at Stoke Row and Checkendon and that building was their store. My family remember the new Boot being built, the first Landlord was a family named Clargo; they moved away to Blewbury and built the mobile home site still there today". John Lightfoot.

Weird Christmas Traditions

As it is the run up to Christmas I thought that I would pause the guitar series and instead get you in the festive mood by telling you about some strange Christmas traditions around the world.

Japan:

In 1974 KFC launched a clever marketing campaign. This, combined with tiny Japanese ovens, led to many locals beginning to eat fried chicken on Christmas day. Nowadays, around 3.6m Japanese people are indulging in KFC for Christmas; in fact demand became so high, that an online service had to be created which enables families to order in advance and have it delivered in festive packaging.

Venezuela:

In the week leading up to Christmas, Venezuelans attend a daily early morning mass church service. Bizzarely, in the capital, Caracas, it is customary to travel to the service on roller skates. This trend has proved so popular that many roads in the capital are closed until 8am to provide safe passage for the worshippers.

Sweden:

Cities across Sweden construct 'Yule Goats' at the beginning of advent each year. These goats are straw structures in the shape of a goat which can reach heights of 40 feet. This unusual tradition was first mentioned in the 11th century as a 'man-sized' goat figure that accompanied Saint Nicholas, however it has increased dramatically in size since. Unfortunately, as you may have guessed, some people see the goat to be more use as a bonfire and thus these goats have been destroyed 36 times since 1966.



Conversations at Christmas time

Christmas is very much a time for conversations - conversations with friends and family, conversations with neighbours and perhaps also with strangers, as we do our Christmas shopping or take part in communal carol singing. Sometimes these conversations will be light-hearted and full of fun, but I'm also well aware that Christmas can also have it's awkward moments. It can be a quite a stressful time, and it's easy for tempers to fray.


As I write these words, I am struck by the number of times conversations feature in the traditional Christmas readings. The accounts of the events surrounding the birth of Jesus found in the gospels, especially in the gospels according to Matthew and Luke, are fully of conversations. Some of these conversations involve a dialogue between a human being and an angel, perhaps most famously in the story of the Annunciation, found in the 1st chapter of Luke's gospel. In this story, the angel Gabriel is sent to the Virgin Mary, and he begins the conversation with the memorable words: "Greetings, favoured one! The Lord is with you". The conversation finishes with Mary saying, "Here am I, the servant of the Lord; let it be with me according to your word".

I think there is something very special about a good conversation. A good conversation is the opposite of a speech or a monologue, in which one speaker gives the audience the benefit of their own particular thoughts and views. A good conversation is a dialogue, in which the parties listen to each other and learn from each other, sharing experiences and allowing the conversation to go where it will go.


I think we can learn so much from a good conversation, and this is why recently I have started hosting a series of conversations around Christianity. These conversations provide an opportunity to explore the questions and issues which might be occupying our minds. The next series starts on Sunday 26th November, and it runs for 4 weeks – you are very welcome to drop in to any one of the sessions, or come to all four!
