

The Recreation Ground is crucial asset for the village but needs all our help to look after it. Gavin Wood, Astons Recreation Committee



Astons eNews

Over the past few months Astons eNews has changed. Until this year, eNews emails were sent out to the Astons community from a personal Gmail address. This has been replaced by a web mail app made available by Web Boutiques who host our community website.

There are now 7 editors taking turns distributing Astons eNews emails. Astons eNews has become a resilient service instead of relying on one or two people if or when they were available.

Astons eNews Protocol

All Astons residents are welcome to sign up to the Astons eNews - the Astons community email service. About 250 already have done so.

Astons eNews sends infrequent village-wide emails with important news/information that cannot wait for the next monthly Astons News.

The following criteria apply to eNews emails:

- The email will be available to everyone in the two parishes.
- Addressees will be invisible to all other recipients to preserve privacy.
- There is an unsubscribe facility on every email.
- No commercials, no jokes, no opinions etc just succinct information about events/activities.
- eNews are normally sent out at the request of the Parish Council, community clubs/groups or individual residents. Occasionally editors may send one out if, for example, they have spotted an unadvertised road closure.
- eNews emails are not sent to highlight individual community events; these are included in the monthly round
 -up eNews emails sent out a week before each Parish Council meeting.
- eNews requests received within 36 hours of, for example, road or post office closures, power outages etc will be processed if editorial resources are available.
- Email addresses supplied to Astons eNews are not used for any other purpose nor are they passed on to other groups, clubs or organisations.

Astons Online CIC

Astons Online community interest company (CIC) has been providing support to computer users since 2011. We started as a community group with a BT grant resulting from the Race to Infinity, won by Blewbury exchange area, which included the Astons. We also had generous support from our Oxfordshire County Councillor, Astons Parish Council and Astons News.

Astons Online has provided support to over 600 computer users, free of charge. People have contacted us from all over South Oxfordshire. Astons Online CIC has recently been highlighted on the Oxfordshire County Council website and in a survey of digital inclusion in the county. We mainly support older people who are uncertain or apprehensive at the rollout of digital services replacing their face-to-face, telephone and postal services. We do this by reaching out to community groups that focus on older people, offering our support to their members.

It is a closed group, so posts cannot be seen by anyone outside the membership. It is a valuable channel for all types of local information and knowledge-sharing in real time.



Olly Glover, MP

After a short holiday at the end of summer, Parliament started sitting on 1st September with a very busy first few weeks for myself and my team.

At Prime Minister's Questions, I challenged Keir Starmer on the government's decisions to scrap the UK Space Agency - based at Harwell - as an executive body and make it part of a government department. With so many local businesses relying on the Space Sector, I will be keeping an eye on how this change impacts funding and governance.

In other debates at Westminster, I raised local concerns about vehicles parking on pavements, and spoke about car-sharing schemes in rural areas. I also had the pleasure of hosting local teenager, Mikayla, whose charity supports children being treated in hospitals across the UK.

My first appearance on ITV's The Last Word gave me the opportunity to talk about the government's cabinet reshuffle and how that impacts on our constituency. —

At a Palestine Solidarity Campaign lobby event, I met with constituents opposing the selling of arms to Israel. Engaging with my constituents on Palestine is vital. Alongside my Liberal Democrat colleagues, I will continue to urge the Government to take action to bring an end to this devastating situation.

I visited the RWE Combined-cycle gas and steam turbine power plant at Milton Park, met with County Council officers to discuss poor broadband coverage in our villages, attended the Wilding and Andrew Service in Wallingford to remember the Canadian servicemen who gave their lives to save the town in 1944, and I met with Post Office staff in Didcot to discuss their challenges and changes to the services they provide.


Discovering and recording the Astons through the ages

I'D FORGOTTEN ABOUT THAT!

When Judy was researching the life of Frederick Ray, one of the Astons soldiers who died during WW2, she was told by family members that the family used to live in a cottage (since demolished) on the right hand side of Chalk Hill opposite the recreation ground.

That reminded me of a village map drawn for us - on the back of a roll of wallpaper - by Les Ray back in the 1990s. I had a look, and there the cottage was. Bingo.





The cottage is also visible in this 1890s photo taken by the Presbyterian minister Thomas Curry (below).







Les had drawn the map to show the positions of lost cottages around the villages. I had known about this period of demolition in the 1950s and 60s, and often wondered why this had happened.

Apparently there was an agricultural depression following World War II, happening at the same time as a statutory increase in wages, which meant farmers could not afford as many workers. This coupled with an increase in mechanisation led to fewer farm workers being employed, and as a result empty cottages fell into disrepair.

Above is a cottage next to the school in Aston Street in about 1950 - does anyone know what it was called? - and on the right the vacant plot left after its demolition in about 1970 (where Ashdown now stands).

Below are two photos of Thatch Cottage on Aston Street (now Abbey Thorn Cottage) showing the kind of neglect that often preceded such demolitions. Luckily commuting became much more common in the 1970s, and cottages became the desirable properties they are today.

Parish Council meeting 17th September 2025 was held face to face in the village hall.

Planning

<u>P25/S2440/LB</u> - For development work at Aston Tirrold Manor, Aston Street, Aston Tirrold. The application is for:

- Roof works: Recover and repair clay tile roof using salvaged and handmade tiles; upgrade insulation with breathable wood fibre; repair timbers and redecorate joinery.
- Chimneys: Localised repointing, repairs, and new flashings.
- Windows and dormers: Replace/ repair all second-floor windows and dormers like-for-like in timber with conservation double glazing.
- Internal reconfiguration: Refurbish second floor to create new bathroom, laundry, cinema and games rooms; restructure stair; upgrade services with minimal intervention, thermal upgrades generally.

Following the report from Listed Buildings the PC are happy to support the application.

P25/S2472/HH

P25/S2473/LB - For development work at Aston Tirrold Manor, Aston Street, Aston Tirrold.

The application is for: Demolition of 2 existing glasshouses and 1 cold frame and the construction of a pool house in its place.

The PC raised some concerns around the lighting the pool house would give off when dark however the owners were able to reassure the PC that there is not going to be significant lighting. On this basis and following the report from Listed Buildings the PC are happy to support the application.

P25/S2524/DIS - For development work at Aston Tirrold Manor, Aston Street, Aston Tirrold.

The application is for: Discharge of condition 3 (details of extract mechanisms) & 4 (material samples/photos) on application ref. P25/S0324/LB (Amalgamation of one dwellinghouse and two self-contained units back into a single-family dwelling, together with associated alterations, including changes to fenestrations. Demolition of existing orangery extension & replacement with new orangery extension in the same footprint. Alterations to existing driveway to facilitate access and new pedestrian gate, with associated landscaping. Addition of 2 x EV charging points.)

The PC acknowledge the application.

P25/S2525/DIS - For development work at Aston Tirrold Manor, Aston Street, Aston Tirrold.

The application is for: Discharge of conditions 7 (Surface Water Drainage) & 8 (Schedule of Materials) on Planning Application P25/S0323/FUL (Amalgamation of one dwellinghouse and two self-contained units back into a single-family dwelling, together with associated alterations, including changes to fenestrations. Demolition of existing orangery extension & replacement with new orangery extension in the same footprint. Alterations to existing driveway to facilitate access and new pedestrian gate, with associated landscaping. Addition of 2 x EV charging points.)

The PC acknowledge the application.

Roads and Traffic

A417 speed limit reducing proposal has been submitted to change from 50 to 40mph from west of Spring Lane to Aston Tirrold to east of Carrimers Farm. It was agreed the Clerk will respond to the proposal saying the PC strongly support this proposal. However, feel the road should remain 40mph once turning into the village and not increase back to 50mph. It was also noted at the bottom of Spring Lane some potholes are still waiting to be filled which were marked a few month ago.

Environmental

- Current thoughts are to put sleepers along the side of the road on Chalk Hill where unofficial pull-ins have damaged the verge, and also along side the two pull-ins on Spring Lane, where there is repeated fly-tipping. Once repaired, the PC will look to plant a variety of flowers. The aim is to prevent people from pulling in on non-maintained areas causing damage to the verge. The PC will look to receive some grants for funding this project.
- Behind the war memorial, and the triangle by Aston Street, where currently daffodils are planted, the plan is to add some flowers and planting to provide bodiversity and interest all year.
- The PC also noted a blocked a metal pipe has emerged from the ground on Spring Lane near Copsestile Farm drain/stream; this part of the village already floods easily so the PC will ask the Flood team at OCC to see what can be done.

Gardening jobs for October:

- If your <u>greenhouse</u> is fairly empty, now's a good time to clean and disinfect it. This lets in more light, and prevents pests and diseases from over-wintering.
- Protect <u>half-hardy plants</u> with fleece or bring them into a frost-free greenhouse.
- Sweep up any fallen leaves that harbour fungal spores and provide ideal hiding places for slugs and snails. Use them to make leaf mould for the garden.
- Lift and divide any overcrowded herbaceous <u>perennials</u> whilst the soil is still warm.
- Lift dahlia tubers, begonia tubers and gladioli corms to store over the winter months. Remove any dead foliage before storing them.
- You can take hardwood cuttings from <u>deciduous</u> <u>shrubs</u> now,
- Prune rambling and climbing roses once they've finished flowering, and tie in the stems before autumn winds cause damage.
- Clear up fallen rose leaves to prevent diseases such as black spot from over-wintering. To avoid the spread of damaging fungi, don't compost the leaves.
- Cut back perennial plants that have died down.
 Alternatively leave the dead foliage in place to shelter friendly wildlife.
- This month is the ideal time to plant hedges, edible hedging, and move trees and shrubs.

Are you interested in Charles Darwin?

I wonder if you have ever wanted to find out more about the life of Charles Darwin, and about the science of Evolution?

Well, here is your opportunity! As part our commitment to science, our churches will be holding a celebration of the life and work of Charles Darwin, at **St Andrew's East Hagbourne on Sunday 19th October**. We will do this in both our morning service (10.30am) and our evening service (6pm) – do come along to which ever suits you best.

The talks are designed for a general audience, and assume no specialist scientific knowledge. The talks also make no assumptions about religious belief – they are accessible to people of all faiths and none. You don't have to believe in God to come along. And, rest assured, they aren't a hidden attempt to try and "convert" people to Christianity. The aim is to celebrate science. So as well as an occasion to celebrate the life and work of Charles Darwin, we will be looking more generally at the science of Evolution, and some of the key developments in this field over the last 150 years or so.

Some people feel or fear that there is a tension or even a contradiction between the science of Evolution and what Christians have traditionally believed about the origin of life and about what it means to be a Human Being made in the image of God. But in fact there is no necessary tension between the Christian faith and the science of Evolution. It is perfectly possible to believe in Jesus Christ and also to believe in the science of Evolution.

And I should add that although I have referred to the "science of Evolution", Evolution is itself a complex area of study with many different approaches and a variety of different theories. There are many different ways of understanding what is meant by "the science of Evolution", and the subject has been continually developing as a scientific discipline since at least the 18th Century. Charles Darwin is a key figure in its development, but there are lots of other scientists who have made significant contributions to the subject.

Interested? Well, do come along on Sunday 19th October to learn more. You will be very welcome!
