

Between April and September 2025, Action Fraud has received 2,790 crime reports relating to Winter Fuel Payment scams, with victims reporting losses totalling over £27,000.

Winter Fuel Payments are made automatically, you do not need to do anything.

If you receive any text messages about Winter Fuel Payments, it's a scam.

Not sure if a message is real? Contact the organisation directly using the contact details on their official website, **not the number or web address in the message**. Your bank (or any other official source) won't ask you to supply personal information by email or text message.

If you have spotted a suspicious SMS or RCS message, you can report it for FREE by forwarding it to 7726.

If you think you've been a victim of fraud, contact your bank immediately and report it to Action Fraud online at [actionfraud.police.uk](https://www.actionfraud.police.uk) or by calling 0300 123 2040,

OXFORD CONGESTION CHARGE Congestion Charge Permits –

The Oxford temporary congestion charge for cars came into effect on 29th October.

- * Oxfordshire residents can apply for a free permit that gives you 25 day passes per car per calendar year.
- * Households can apply for a maximum of two cars.
- * Each pass is valid for one day's travel for all six congestion charge locations.
- * Without a permit, car drivers can choose an alternative route or mode of transport or pay the daily charge.
- * Additional permits are available for certain groups including Blue Badge holders, unpaid carers, community health and care workers, mobile traders and patients required to attend frequent hospital appointments in Oxford.

Round up for 2025

Gardens never stand still. With exciting planting choices, new ways of growing and maintaining spaces and of course the constant challenges the weather / climate brings. No two years seem the same. 2025 has seen people growing in ways that reflected their interests and personality rather than just for aesthetics or subsistence. Apparently, this theme is set to continue.

There has been increasing pressure on wildlife, particularly where green spaces have and continue to be overtaken by construction. Local initiatives, such as The Springline Project engage residents and visitors to encourage interconnectivity between villages such as the Astons and Cholsey.

The 'Picks Field Project' is a great example of how landowners and residents work together to increase biodiversity through research and sympathetic management. Approximately three years ago a small number of resident landowners added a long native boundary hedge adjoining two open fields. A recent study by them and ecologists has demonstrated the value of providing this shelter and food source. Rare species of wildlife have been recorded.

Outdoor jobs for December

Prune climbing roses between now and February

Protect terracotta and other pots from cracking in freezing weather by putting them inside or wrapping in bubble polythene

Keep raking up fallen leaves in borders that could be harbouring slugs and other pests

Plant bare-root roses and other deciduous shrubs, plus ornamental trees

Hang bird feeders near roses to attract hungry birds that will also pick off any overwintering pests

Cut stems of berried winter shrubs, seasonal flowers and evergreen leaves for festive decorations and wreaths, leaving some for the wildlife

Move plants in pots to a sheltered spot if conditions turn very cold, as their roots are more exposed to the elements

Plant fragrant winter shrubs in pots on the doorstep, including chimonanthus and Daphne odora

Hard prune overgrown shrubs and hedges while they're dormant

We are a small band of volunteers who give an hour of our time when we can to gather statistics and to raise awareness with those driving at excessive speeds.



Astons eNews

Over the past few months Astons eNews has changed. Until this year, eNews emails were sent out to the Astons community from a personal Gmail address. This has been replaced by a web mail app made available by Web Boutiques who host our community website.

There are now 7 editors taking turns distributing Astons eNews emails. Astons eNews has become a resilient service instead of relying on one or two people if or when they were available.

Astons eNews Protocol

All Astons residents are welcome to sign up to the Astons eNews - the Astons community email service. About 250 already have done so.

Astons eNews sends infrequent village-wide emails with important news/information that cannot wait for the next monthly Astons News.

The following criteria apply to eNews emails:

- The email will be available to everyone in the two parishes.
- Addressees will be invisible to all other recipients to preserve privacy.
- There is an unsubscribe facility on every email.
- No commercials, no jokes, no opinions etc - just succinct information about events/activities.
- eNews are normally sent out at the request of the Parish Council, community clubs/groups or individual residents. Occasionally editors may send one out if, for example, they have spotted an unadvertised road closure.
- eNews emails are not sent to highlight individual community events; these are included in the monthly round-up eNews emails sent out a week before each Parish Council meeting.
- eNews requests received within 36 hours of, for example, road or post office closures, power outages etc will be processed if editorial resources are available.
- Email addresses supplied to Astons eNews are not used for any other purpose nor are they passed on to other groups, clubs or organisations.

Astons Online CIC

Astons Online community interest company (CIC) has been providing support to computer users since 2011. We started as a community group with a BT grant resulting from the Race to Infinity, won by Blewbury exchange area, which included the Astons. We also had generous support from our Oxfordshire County Councillor, Astons Parish Council and Astons News.

Astons Online has provided support to over 600 computer users, free of charge. People have contacted us from all over South Oxfordshire. Astons Online CIC has recently been highlighted on the Oxfordshire County Council website and in a survey of digital inclusion in the county. We mainly support older people who are uncertain or apprehensive at the rollout of digital services replacing their face-to-face, telephone and postal services. We do this by reaching out to community groups that focus on older people, offering our support to their members.

The Astons Villagers Facebook Community (AVFC)

The Astons Villagers Facebook Community is an Fb group for residents of the Astons only (plus a small number of approved non-villagers). It is a closed group, so posts cannot be seen by anyone outside the membership. It is a valuable channel for all types of local information and knowledge-sharing in real time.

Local Government Reorganisation news

(SODC Vale of White Horse district council)

A new future for local councils – more efficient, better services, local to your community


After the government asked us to draw up plans to change how councils work in the area, last week we formally agreed to support a proposal for two new, innovative, and locally accountable unitary authorities. The new councils would:

- * Deliver better services: The proposal responds to what residents have said needs improving, from highways and social care to planning.
- * Offer the best financial outcomes: Independent modelling shows it could deliver the greatest potential savings (£59.8m annually) and lowest financial risk of all three proposals, helping to protect key services and ensure long-term stability across Oxfordshire and West Berkshire.
- * Boost both rural and urban economies: Drive sustainable growth across Oxford, market towns and rural areas, creating more jobs, better transport and the right homes in the right places.
- * Create councils responsive to their communities: Keep councils close to all local communities and tailored to their specific needs, ensuring strong local accountability and representation.

What is the proposal? (see picture below)

Our two-unitary proposal – which is one of three being put forward for the area – would create two councils covering the following geographical areas:

- Oxford and Shires Council would comprise all of the existing district areas of Cherwell, Oxford City and West Oxfordshire.
- Ridgeway Council would be made up of the whole of West Berkshire Council's area and all of the existing district areas of South Oxfordshire and the Vale of White Horse.



Other proposals

The other two options are:

- * A large single unitary council for Oxfordshire led by Oxfordshire County Council
- * Three unitary councils based around an expanded Oxford City area known as Greater Oxford, led by Oxford City Council

Last week, alongside four other councils in Oxfordshire and West Berkshire, we published our draft proposal at: twocouncils.org

Following Cabinet and Executive meetings at the councils, a consensus emerged with all five councils formally supporting our proposal for two new, innovative, and locally accountable unitary authorities.

This means that after reviewing all three proposals for Oxfordshire and West Berkshire, the majority of councils in the area have agreed that the two-unitary option offers the best outcomes for local residents and will urge the government to proceed with the proposal when a decision is made next year.

Of the 158 councillors in attendance at meetings across the areas, 142 voted to support the two-unitary proposal, 9 were against and 7 abstained, showing overwhelming support that the two-unitary option is the best for their areas. Councillors also raised concerns about the other proposals.

For the [single-unitary proposal](#) put forward by Oxfordshire County Council, they expressed concerns that it was too large, would be far too distant from communities and did not show the ambition local communities and businesses deserved.

For the [three-unitary proposal](#) put forward by Oxford City, they expressed concerns that it would not create financially sustainable councils, did not meet the government criteria, and would negatively impact the green belt.

Next steps

We will submit our proposal to the government before the 28 November deadline, and we anticipate that the government will consult on all proposals for the area in spring 2026 before deciding later in the summer. The government's preferred model is scheduled to become fully operational in 2028.

The Story Behind a Famous Carol

Every carol has a story to tell. For example, you may be interested to learn that the origin of the carol "O Little Town of Bethlehem" lies in a visit to the Holy Land made back in the 1860s by a famous American preacher and minister, Revd Phillips Brooks. Brooks was the minister at Holy Trinity Church, Philadelphia. On his return from the Holy Land, he wrote a carol for use by his Sunday school – the carol we know today as "O Little Town of Bethlehem". It was sung to a tune specially composed by his church organist, Lewis Redner; this tune continues to be popular in the USA, but in England the carol is usually sung to "Forest Green", an adaptation of an English Folk-tune.

Brooks' carol has become one of the best loved of all our Christmas carols. As with many carols, the text has evolved over the years. You may be interested to learn that the original version contained the following verse – a verse which, as far as I know, is no longer sung today:

"Where children pure and happy
Pray to the blessed Child,
Where misery cries out to thee,
Son of the Mother mild;
Where charity stands watching
And faith holds wide the door,
The dark night wakes, the glory breaks,
And Christmas comes once more".

I think it is a pity that this verse is no longer sung, for it reminds us Christmas isn't just the remembrance of some past event. It is a reminder that Jesus is alive today, and that He wishes to come into our lives and into our communities, bringing His gifts of love, forgiveness and healing. Our task is to make Jesus welcome, by "watching" with a spirit of love, and "holding open" the door of faith – faith in the goodness and power of God, to bring new hope into a world which is so often full of weariness and suffering.

My prayer is that this Christmas time we see afresh the glory of God's love and God's light breaking into our own lives and into our communities – a time when we can truly say that "Christmas comes once more".

Message from your MP, Ollie Glover

In Parliament,

Nearly £200,000 has been awarded to 49 community and voluntary organisations across the whole of the Thames Valley to support crime prevention initiatives.

My Community Fund is always hugely over subscribed with 248 applications submitted for over £1.7m of funding, so unfortunately many will be disappointed.

The Community Fund provides support to voluntary and community groups that help to prevent crime and keep communities safe. Importantly money for the Community Fund comes from proceeds from the sale of items seized from criminals that cannot be returned to their rightful owners and court orders. Making criminals pay, rather than the cash coming from taxpayers.

13/099 Planning

To consider the following planning permissions:

P25/S3237/FUL – For development work at the following location: Cowderys Yard, Spring Lane, Aston Tirrold.

The application is for: Phased development. Demolition of two existing buildings. Construction of new self-build dwelling and related works.

The owners of Cowderys Yard attended the meeting and presented their plans for the proposed development to the Parish Council. Councillor Knight raised several questions regarding the submitted drawings. Specifically, the overview images lacked measurements; in the west elevation, the highest point appeared to be the central section, while in the north and south elevations the gable ends were taller than the main body of the house. The drawings did not appear to align consistently.

The residents confirmed that a height restriction is in place and that the build will not exceed the height of neighbouring properties. A bat survey indicated that no bats are currently residing in the barn, although there have been numerous sightings of bats in the surrounding area. Councillor Knight expressed concern about the extensive use of glazing and its potential impact on local wildlife. The residents responded that they have been advised during pre planning advice and have already reduced the proposed glazing. External lighting has been kept to essential use only. The majority of glazing faces the garden and will not impact neighbouring properties. They also confirmed plans to increase the number of trees on the site.

Given the significant movement of materials to and from the site, the Parish Council requested that the owners remain mindful of traffic entering and leaving the village. Following discussion, the Parish Council unanimously voted to support the application.

Roads and traffic – Works have commenced on Spring Lane, where two rows of kerbstones have been installed and drainage improvements are underway. The existing surface is scheduled to be removed, followed by resurfacing. The gully has been altered to ensure that all water will drain away effectively. It was noted that potholes previously reported remain unrepairs. Councillor Knight will submit a further report via the "Fix My Street" service.
