

Public testing of the Emergency Alerts system on 7 September 2025 at 3pm

The government will be carrying out a national test of the UK Emergency Alerts system. The system is designed to provide vital information and advice during emergencies. The test alert will be sent to all compatible 4G and 5G mobile phones and compatible tablets across the UK.

What the test will look and sound like

An emergency alert looks and sounds very different to other types of messages you might receive on your phone. You'll hear a loud, siren-like sound and your phone or tablet will vibrate.

If you have a vision or hearing impairment, audio and vibration attention signals will let you know you have received the test.

Why the test is taking place

Regular testing ensures the system is functioning correctly, should it be needed in an emergency.

The test is not intended to alert you to real danger and you will not need to take any further action.

Opt out of the test

You can opt out of emergency alerts, including the national test, but you should keep them switched on for your own safety. Learn more about how to opt out at www.gov.uk

Proposed Changes to local government in Oxfordshire will affect everything currently covered by SODC and OCC, including roads, schools, planning, social care, bin collection etc. Parishes aren't even mentioned in the government's White Paper. Also, the effects of centralising planning on NDP's and local plan-

ning in general. These concerns notwithstanding, Westminster has asked local authorities to draw up plans for new unitary councils across England of around 500,000 people each, which, in Oxfordshire, would replace the current two-tier system (SODC, and OCC).

Vale, SODC, West Oxfordshire, Cherwell and West Berkshire Councils support the formation of two new unitaries, splitting the county in two – ours falls into 'Ridgeway', including West Berks, SODC and Vale. The other includes Oxford City, WODC and Cherwell.

Oxford City Council does not support this – they would prefer a 'doughnut' council encompassing the city and its greenbelt, plus northern and southern unitaries (both would not contain enough people), or a single unitary covering the whole county.

There are 70 parishes within the proposed new Ridgeway council. If it was a bigger unitary council, our parish input (e.g. to influence speeding measures, road plans, schools etc) would likely become more limited There is a question over what would happen to assets such as Cornerstone and various leisure centres. If the local authority is Oxford-based, it may be that outlying facilities could be rationalised or closed



Picks Field Update

It's been a glorious summer, and the Field has been looking glorious too! We've loved seeing villagers' posts about the fabulous nature they've enjoyed there.

Members of the Aston's Nature Recovery Group spent a hot July day training to scythe with the fabulous Nicole from https://joyofscything.uk/. Astons now has its own team of trained scythers! It was so much easier and more fun than we could ever have imagined, despite the 32C heat... And extremely satisfying!

We learned to use Austrian scythes, which are half the weight of the Poldark-style English scythes, making them easy to use irrespective of your strength and stature. We learned about the physics and mechanics of blades, blade maintenance, how to scythe effectively with little effort, and about the history of scything.

Why? Scything is a traditional nature-sensitive method to help control dominant grasses which threaten the special chalk grassland ecosystem in Picks Field. We have a grant from TOE (Trust for Oxfordshire's Environment) which has funded training and equipment purchase for this purpose.

Fancy it? We have funding to train a further six villagers. Nicole is coming back to the village on the 20th Sept to do this training. And we're still looking for some keen wannabe-scythers! It's free to villagers who are willing to commit to becoming a regular scyther for Picks Field. OUR LATEST eBay PURCHASE:

When I saw this postcard (below left) of Baker Street in the 1930s on eBay I knew straight away that the house on the left was The Lanes. But the distinctive porch on the house to the right confused me - from its position I thought it must be Baldons, but Baldons has no door onto the road.

Then I remembered that at last year's Freshers' Day at the Village Hall I was chatting to Berenice Cox (who lives at Baldons) about a photo of a shop on Baker Street that we had, and she told me about an old photo showing the shop that they had - which she has very kindly let me scan for the archive. I think you'll agree that it is a really charming photo (below right).

Anyway, looking at Baldons in the background you can see that Baldons at that time did have a door and porch on the roadside wall. Bingo! At the bottom of this page is the photo we already had, and in which I assumed the shop was facing the road - but from Berenice's photo it looks as if it is side on to the road. So, as ever, it shows that you can learn new things about village history in unexpected ways.

Astons eNews

Over the past few months Astons eNews has changed. Until this year, eNews emails were sent out to the Astons community from a personal Gmail address. This has been replaced by a web mail app made available by Web Boutiques who host our community website.

There are now 7 editors taking turns distributing Astons eNews emails. Astons eNews has become a resilient service instead of relying on one or two people if or when they were available.

Astons eNews Protocol

All Astons residents are welcome to sign up to the Astons eNews - the Astons community email service. About 250 already have done so.

Astons eNews sends infrequent village-wide emails with important news/information that cannot wait for the next monthly Astons News.

The following criteria apply to eNews emails:

- The email will be available to everyone in the two parishes.
- Addressees will be invisible to all other recipients to preserve privacy.
- There is an unsubscribe facility on every email.
- No commercials, no jokes, no opinions etc just succinct information about events/activities.
- eNews are normally sent out at the request of the Parish Council, community clubs/groups or individual residents. Occasionally editors may send one out if, for example, they have spotted an unadvertised road closure.
- eNews emails are not sent to highlight individual community events; these are included in the monthly round -up eNews emails sent out a week before each Parish Council meeting.
- eNews requests received within 36 hours of, for example, road or post office closures, power outages etc will be processed if editorial resources are available.
- Email addresses supplied to Astons eNews are not used for any other purpose nor are they passed on to other groups, clubs or organisations.

Astons Online CIC

Astons Online community interest company (CIC) has been providing support to computer users since 2011. We started as a community group with a BT grant resulting from the Race to Infinity, won by Blewbury exchange area, which included the Astons. We also had generous support from our Oxfordshire County Councillor, Astons Parish Council and Astons News.

Astons Online has provided support to over 600 computer users, free of charge. People have contacted us from all over South Oxfordshire. Astons Online CIC has recently been highlighted on the Oxfordshire County Council website and in a survey of digital inclusion in the county. We mainly support older people who are uncertain or apprehensive at the rollout of digital services replacing their face-to-face, telephone and postal services. We do this by reaching out to community groups that focus on older people, offering our support to their members.

The Astons Villagers Facebook Community (AVFC)

The Astons Villagers Facebook Community is an Fb group for residents of the Astons only (plus a small number of approved non-villagers). It is a closed group, so posts cannot be seen by anyone outside the membership. It is a valuable channel for all types of local information and knowledge-sharing in real time.

Apple juicing in Blewbury.

We offer a service in apple juicing each year so that your fallen apples can be put to good use by juicing and preserving them. Our sessions will take place at the Manor, Berry Lane on 31 August, 21 September, 5 and 24 October from 2 to 4pm.

Bring washed apples (bad bits removed but not cores) and your own clean bottles or containers. Arrive by 3pm if you want to pasteurise your juice (which will need glass screw top bottles).

Costs: £1.50 to press a large bucket or basket of apples plus 30p per bottle to pasteurize. You can also freeze unpasteurised juice (in plastic containers).

We do not supply bottles or containers. If you have a large quantity of apples, you can hire our equipment for a charge of £20 per day.

The most common crime: Domestic Abuse

Around a fifth of the jobs a police officer will have during a shift could be some form of domestic abuse, and it is a crime that exists in every community, urban and rural.

Domestic abuse isn't just physical—it can be emotional, financial, sexual, or controlling behaviour. It can be incredibly hard to reach out. Our specially trained domestic abuse teams offer a compassionate and confidential service. We work closely with local partners, such as victim support charities, housing services, and healthcare providers, to ensure people can access the right help at the right time.

You can contact us at any time by calling 101—or 999 in an emergency. If speaking isn't safe, you can press 55 when prompted after calling 999 (this is known as the "Silent Solution"). The call handler will do everything they can to determine your location so they can deploy officers to you; if you can say one thing, please say your address. You can also report online at thamesvalley.police.uk.

Victims First is the victims service run by my office that provides free support for anyone who has been a victim of crime in Thames Valley. Officers will talk to you about any emotional or practical needs you may have, and then will help you access help and support. They may offer to refer you to specialist local organisations who have experience in supporting those who have experienced abuse, but no referrals will be made without your consent.

You are welcome to contact Victims First to access support if you have reported the Domestic Abuse to the police, or if you have not made contact with the police at all.

Are you doing anything on 13th September?

I wonder if you have heard of a charity called the Oxfordshire Historic Churches Trust? The charity exists to give grants to churches of all denominations towards the costs of repair and maintenance, and will also support plans to improve and upgrade church facilities. Every year, they promote an event called "Ride and Stride", which encourages people to be sponsored to visit as many churches as possible. Funds raised are split equally between a designated church and the charity as a whole. This year, Ride and Stride takes place on Saturday 13th September.

Oxfordshire Historic Churches Trust is an excellent charity, and many churches in our area have successfully applied for grants from the trust. (I should add that I serve as the local Area Representative, so do be in touch if you have any further questions!)

Why is the work of the trust so important? In short, it is because it is getting harder and harder for churches to find the money and volunteers to look after their buildings and to adapt them appropriately for the 21st Century. Looking at England, Wales and Scotland as a whole, it is widely recognised that the situation has reached a crisis point. Christian denominations are no longer able to look after their historic buildings. They simply don't have the money or the people to do so.

Some denominations, such as the Church of Scotland, are undertaking a radical programme of church closure. However, the Church of England has avoided taking such a radical step, and is trying its best to muddle through. Individual churches are encouraged to keep on top of regular maintenance, in the hope that regular maintenance will forestall major problems with the building. Churches are also encouraged to open themselves to wider use by community groups. Some grants are also available, and charities such as Oxfordshire Historic Churches Trust play a significant role. Many churches also benefit from "Friends" schemes.

But at the end of the day, it would be fair to say that as a whole, the Church of England is finding it harder and harder to care for the historic church buildings for which it is responsible. It simply doesn't have the money or the volunteers needed to take care of the thousands of buildings under its care. Something needs to be done. But what? All thoughts gratefully received!

In the meantime, if you value our historic churches, I would encourage you to support the work of charities such as the Oxford Historic Churches Trust. Perhaps you might be tempted to take part in the Ride and Stride on Saturday 13th September? It's great fun, and you will be playing your part in helping us to preserve our precious church buildings, not only for own generation but also for generations to come.

Happy birthday Rainbow Warrior

www.greenpeace.org.uk. Greenpeace celebrates a 40th Anniversary this year. It is respectable now: governments consult them on climate issues, but 40 years ago they were extremely controversial.

In July 1985, the Greenpeace flagship Rainbow Warrior, a symbol of peace, had just returned from a visit to the Marshall Islands, whose inhabitants were still suffering the horrific effects of nuclear fallout following the 1954 testing of the American H-bomb Bravo – a weapon 1,000 times more powerful than the Hiroshima bomb.

It arrived in Auckland Harbour, New Zealand, where they were planning to protest against French nuclear tests in French Polynesia, but two explosions sank the ship, killing a crew member. The bombs had been placed by French divers, but the French stated that their purpose was never to endanger crew members.

Thames Valley Police statistics released

As part of our ongoing commitment to inform the public of the work we do, Thames Valley Police is today (29/4) releasing statistics on our activity from the last financial year, from 1 April 2023 to 31 March 2024.

There have been over 400,000 calls to 999, over 470,000 calls to 101, and over 108,000 online reports to our contact management centres.

We have attended 160,000 incidents, made 33,000 arrests, and helped find 5,687 missing people.

We policed the King's Coronation in Windsor, which was another of the most significant policing operations in the history of the Force. We helped people to stay safe at many other events including Reading Festival, Royal Ascot and Henley Regatta.

Oxfordshire Trading Standards: Courier Fraud

Courier fraud occurs when a criminal arranges for someone to withdraw large sums of money or purchase expensive items such as gold, jewellery or expensive watches on their behalf, usually after convincing them it needs to be seized as part of an

ongoing police investigation, In many cases victims are instructed to visit a jewellers via a cab — often incurring steep travel costs.

In one case, an 84-year-old person was targeted by scammers impersonating a Police Officer and persuaded to withdraw cash and travel via taxi to a bullion dealer to buy gold. The fraudsters remained on the phone throughout and attempted to arrange a courier pickup. Fortunately, the family intervened before the assets were handed over **To stay safe and protect yourself:**

- Your bank or the police will never call you to ask you to verify your personal details or PIN by phone or offer to pick up your card by courier. Hang up, wait a few minutes and call your bank on a number you know to be genuine, such as the one on the back of your card, or by calling 159 (a operator will transfer you straight to your bank)
- The police or your bank will not contact you out of the blue to participate in an investigation or send a courier to your home to collect bank cards, cash, or other valuable items. Any requests to do so are a scam.
- Don't trust Caller ID display on your phone it's not proof of ID.
- Remember, staying cautious and sceptical can go a long way in protecting yourself from courier fraud. Take
 the time to verify information, seek advice from trusted sources, and never rush into making financial
 decisions under pressure.
