

Miller's Field Update 2



Many of you will have seen the heavy forestry kit working away on Miller's Field – this is the piece of land [on the bend] in Baker Street, just a stone's throw from the newly re -opened Chequers.

Mr. Miller bought the land in 1973 and since then it has been [largely] neglected. He originally sought house Planning permission for this plot, but my interest is in the restoration and conservation of a natural landscape to support wildlife.

All the diseased and dangerous trees have been removed. Those included ash, which also had Ash Dieback Disease. An overmature poplar which had aerial deadwood throughout the crown, was seriously ivy-clad and in decline. The large central willow has been pollard – a normal treatment for willows. It was in poor condition with significant decay to the willow stool, along with multiple failed lateral limbs. Two sycamore were removed as they were in poor [health] form and vigour due to squirrel damage.

The large hawthorn area was thinned to allow the better trees light and space to develop into good specimens. Part of the felling licence requirements means that any tree removed is replaced at a ratio of 3 to 1. These replacement species are to be broadleaves, including lime, beech and oak with Woodland edge planting to include holly, hazel, viburnum and spindle.

I will be planting a mixed native hedge behind the post and rail fencing which will replace the existing barbed wire – this will make the frontage in keeping with the adjacent field.





The next phase is to get the ditches cleared around the site so that the springs can run freely. I also plan to have a central pond contoured where there is already a large bog area, which is due to silting and heavy reed growth, as a result of neglect of the waterway. This water body will provide a haven for many different forms of wildlife.

In the dormant winter months, replacement tree planting will start, and I am looking forward to making a new orchard to include apples, plums, damsons, cherries and mulberries. This area will be under seeded with wildflowers to provide nectar for pollinators,

which are currently in decline.

I hope you will enjoy watching this land transform into a wildlife haven over the years.

Astons Outdoors - It's not just about plants & Wildlife!

Autumn is now well and truly upon us, and the hedgerows are brimming with all sorts of goodies to harvest, blackberries, elderberries, rose hips, hazelnuts, walnuts...... Why not make some jams, syrups, jellies and pickles ready for Christmas and maybe a couple of extras for next year's Astons Fayre. Remember to leave behind plenty for the wildlife to feast on.

Autumn is also time to start preparing gardens for the winter by cutting back perennials, splitting any that are too large and mulching the beds. Try to leave a few old flower stalks in place and a small pile of branches/logs for the insects to hibernate in over winter, or better still build a designated hibernating area in a quiet corner of your garden with lots of your garden debris. Please pot up any plants that you would otherwise be discarding ready for next year's Plant Sale. We have hundreds of pots of all sizes if needed so please get in touch and we will drop them off at your house. October is also a good time to dig up any perennial weeds in veg plots in readiness for a good layer of mulch.

If the weather starts to get cooler towards the end of the month and most of the berries and seeds have disappeared, please remember the wild animals and birds will need supplementary food putting out for them. Hedgehogs need to fatten up before hibernating and birds need to store lots of calories to get through the colder nights.

A date for your diaries: Sunday 20th November.

We will be starting the next phase of the Village bulb planting scheme and the last phase of planting at the Village Hall. Please look out for more information in the November Village News as we will be needing all of you wonderful volunteers to help us.

Also look out for a Christmas wreath workshop that we will be organising in early December. Now is a good time to start collecting seed heads, fir cones, etc to dry out in readiness for your wreaths.

The Church and Healing

On the 18th of October, the church celebrates the life and work of an early Christian called St. Luke. As well as being the author of the Gospel of St Luke and, very probably, of the Acts of the Apostles, St. Luke was a doctor and a disciple of St. Paul. Perhaps unsurprisingly, St. Luke has become the patron saint of doctors and surgeons; he has also become the patron saint of artists.

Many churches use the feast of St. Luke as a time to pray for everyone involved in providing health care. We think of doctors and nurses, of course; but there are so many other people who play key roles in our medical system, and we pray for them as well.

There has always been a close connection between the Christian faith and the provision of health care. Christians believe that God cares about our health – not only the health of individuals, but also the health of our societies. Health needs to be seen in its widest sense. It's not just about the absence of illness. It's about fulness of life: and this means mental and spiritual health, as well as physical health.

God wants to bring healing: to heal us as individuals, and to heal our communities. Sometimes, this healing requires medical care: we go to a doctor, and the doctor prescribes a particular drug. But sometimes the healing process does not involve a doctor or a hospital at all. For example, it might be that we feel isolated or overwhelmed, and we are restored to good health through the support of our friends.

For some, care for the environment is a natural next step in the Christian ministry of healing. Many might say that our relationship with the environment has been broken by human selfishness and greed. The natural world groans with pain, and we need to put this right: we need to bring health and wholeness to a wounded planet.

I wonder: where might we need healing in our own lives? And where might we need healing in the lives of our communities? How might we pray about this? What practical steps might we take to help to bring about the healing which we seek?

Parliament sat on Friday and Saturday in order that MPs could give their tributes to the late Queen. In total across the 2 days, 321 MPs gave their tributes to Her Majesty, including myself, shortly before 10pm on the Friday (you can watch it at www.david-johnston.org.uk). Before that, we received the live broadcast to the nation from our new King in the House of Commons.

The MP speeches were emotional, funny and heartfelt. Over and over the same themes emerged: that even when you hadn't met her you felt like you knew her; that she had given an incredible service to our nation; that she was sharp, passionate, selfless and mischievous, with twinkling eyes.

I bounced between different ceremonies in the constituency and in Parliament during the period of mourning, each of them poignant, but none so emotional as filing past Her Majesty's coffin in Westminster Hall when she was lying-in-state.

It is a momentous time for our nation and for the Royal Family. Our new King assumes his responsibilities at a time of great sadness for him and his family. I've no doubt he will be an excellent King. He has shown in his time as Prince of Wales the care and concern he has for this country and has had decades to learn from Her Majesty (who became Queen at just 25) the best way to conduct the role. May Queen Elizabeth II Rest In Peace and God Save the King.

The period of mourning of course affected the activities that I undertook this month, but around it were still several visits and events, including the Didcot Twinning Association's reception for the Mayor of Meylan, an area of France that Didcot is twinned with, and a fundraising launch for a 14th century chantry window in All Saint's Church, North Moreton. Two other things to note: September is Alzheimer's Month and I know a lot of your families - like my own - have been affected by related conditions, so as a 'Dementia Friend' I encourage people to take part in activities supporting this.

Similarly, the 2nd of October is Silver Sunday, the national day for older people, with plenty of events going on which I have been asked to encourage people to participate in or run. You find out more at https://silversunday.org.uk

Warm Home Discount rules updated for 2022-23 – Citizens Advice



As winter approaches, many people will be nervously anticipating the cold weather and its inevitable effect on their heating bills. The Warm Home Discount (WHD) was introduced by the government in 2011 to offset some of this burden.

For 2022-2023 there have been a couple of significant changes to the WHD: the number of energy suppliers participating in the scheme will increase, and those on disability benefits who

don't have low incomes nor high energy costs will not receive the WHD.

The value of the WHD payment is currently £150. Nobody needs to apply in order to receive it, with the exception of those living in mobile homes on a park home site (see below). The payment is credited automatically to the consumer's electricity supply account (or credit is directly applied to a pre-payment meter), and energy suppliers have to make this payment by 31 March each year at the latest.

Eligibility for the WHD is ascertained by means of data-matching between energy suppliers and government departments. There are three eligible groups of consumers: low-income pensioner households; low-income people on some means-tested benefits; and households with high energy costs. This last criterium is determined by the type of property you live in, especially its age and its floor area (based on information supplied by the Valuation Office Agency or the Land Registry).

There is an alternative form of WHD for those living in mobile homes on park home sites. For more information about this, visit www.gov.uk and search for "Warm Home Discount". Below are a couple of photos to mark of course the exciting works on Millers Field - thanks to Jeremy for the fantastic photo below left!


Below those is a sadder photo of the effect of dead elm disease in the 1970s, recorded by Stephen Whitwell. You may remember the recently donated painting of Downs View in 1979 in an earlier issue. When looking at it closely I saw that the walnut tree on the island in front was staked, so obviously a new tree. Putting two and two together I realised this was part of the parish councils' tree planting programme at the time to ameliorate the loss of the elms. Another walnut tree was planted outside the village school on Aston Street, and also the now splendid row of trees that line The Croft. The councils have also of course recently undertaken another such tree planting programme.

On the next page are photos taken for a particular reason, but which inadvertently show us part of Aston history otherwise lost to us.











These two photos, one taken in the 1970s of Edlins and one taken in the 1990s of a fire at Frimley Stables, show in the background the various buildings around the stable yard - otherwise unrecorded.



This 1970s photo shows race horses returning from the gallops up on the Downs, and also shows us two large poplars beside the war memorial, and an old Chequers Inn sign - very topical.



This 1920s photo of the Astons School football team also shows the school toilet block - and in particular the open air urinal that ex pupils have told me much about!

SOFO Museum online talk explores the experience of Oxfordshire men fighting in the Great War's 'forgotten army' in Salonika

- Online talk streaming on the SOFO Museum website from 7pm, Thursday 27 October 2022
- Covers the lesser-known conflict in Salonika during the Great War, where two battalions of the county regiment fought.
- Speaker Alan Wakefield is a curator at the Imperial War Museum and author of *Under the Devil's*Eye: Britain's Forgotten Army at Salonika 1915-1918
- Free to view, donations are encouraged during the stream in support of Soldiers of Oxfordshire
 Trust

In the next online talk hosted by the Soldiers of Oxfordshire (SOFO) Museum, to be streamed alongside a live Q&A on 27 October at 7pm, Alan Wakefield will detail the campaign of the British Salonika Force during WW1, including the part played by soldiers of the county.

Though now a forgotten front, during the Great War large numbers of British and allied troops were tied up in the strategically vital Balkans. The county regiment, The Oxfordshire & Buckinghamshire Light Infantry, would send two battalions from the Western Front to see out the remainder of their service in the campaign.

Alan Wakefield has researched the lesser-known Salonika Campaign in every detail, from the arrival of the first British troops in 1915 to final victory. He is head of the First World War and Early Twentieth Century team at IWM and co-authored *Under the Devil's Eye: Britain's Forgotten Army at Salonika 1915-1918*.

Using first-hand accounts, Alan paints a vivid picture of life for the British Army while there. Learn of the disappointments of the British XII Corps offensive in April/May 1917 (The First Battle of Doiran) and the more successful aggressive raiding in the Struma Valley.

The talk, followed by a live Question & Answer session, will be streamed freely (no ticket or sign-up required) from the SOFO website, but donations will be welcomed from those wishing to support the museum.

Like all previous online talks the museum has hosted, an archived feed of the talk and recorded Q&A will also remain available from the museum website after the live event ends.

Action Targeting Modern Slavery and Human Trafficking

In partnership with the National Crime Agency (NCA) and Europol, officers from Thames Valley Police identified a number of potential victims of modern slavery following three weeks of activity focusing on massage parlours under Project Aidant, an NCA-led law-enforcement response.

The activity took place between 22 August and 9 September as part of a Europe-wide operation, involving partners from Immigration Enforcement and local councils. The project aims to enhance and develop our knowledge of modern slavery linked to massage parlours, focusing specifically on adults or children (under 18) who have been trafficked to the UK, or exploited in the UK.

During Project Aidant, officers visited 57 premises across the Thames Valley and encountered 50+ people who were spoken to about Modern Slavery and given advice. Of those people, 5 were identified as potential victims and safeguarded.

Chief Superintendent Jim Weems, Head of Force Intelligence and Specialist Operations, said: Concerns around modern slavery can be reported to the Modern Slavery Helpline.

If you think you are, or have been, a victim of modern slavery there are organisations that can help including our Victims First Specialist Service which incorporates specialist skills and knowledge on exploitation and modern slavery.

They can provide practical and emotional support, tailored to meet your individual needs, to help you cope with the effects of the crime.
